

## FRED AND JOYCE ALIOTA SCHOLARSHIP

The Fred and Joyce Aliota Scholarship was founded by the Fred and Joyce Aliota family and the Hartford City Band, Inc.

Frederick C. Aliota, 58, Pupil Services Director for the Hartford Common School District and a former director of the Hartford City Band died July 1st, 1980, of a viral infection of the central nervous system.

Fred Aliota was employed by the Hartford Common School District for 28 years as a teacher, psychologist, and most recently, Pupil Services Director in charge of special education programs.



Fred was director of the Hartford City Band for 24 years. He gave up directing the Band at the end of August, 1977, but remained in the Band as a percussionist.

### INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

1. The Fred and Joyce Aliota Scholarship is a \$2,000.00 scholarship awarded annually to a music student living in the Hartford area who is pursuing a music degree at an accredited college or university. The Scholarship will be payable on a semester basis. The selection of the recipient of the Scholarship will be made by the Scholarship Selection Committee consisting of appointed members of the local community. The Scholarship may be awarded to the same applicant more than once providing their selection has the approval of the Scholarship Selection Committee. The Scholarship Selection Committee will evaluate the applicants on their musical career objectives, scholastic ability, character, and financial need.
2. The Fred and Joyce Aliota Scholarship is available to any senior or graduate of a Hartford area high school who is pursuing a degree in vocal or instrumental music, music education, or a related music industry field.
3. To apply, each applicant must submit the following to Hartford City Band Scholarship Committee before March 15th:
  - a. The Application Form completely filled out.
  - b. Letters of recommendation from three references other than relatives including one from a music teacher.
  - c. A transcript of all the applicant's completed schooling and class rank to be sent directly to the Hartford City Band Scholarship Committee by a school official.
4. Finalists may be asked to meet with the Scholarship Selection Committee for a personal interview.
